7 HOTSPOTS

Zoo Outreach Organisation and the IUCN SSC South Asian Invertebrate Specialist Group initiated the first ever Tiger Beetle Red Listing exercise. The 5-day workshop conducted in Coimbatore assessed 122 species endemic to India. 12 experts contributed to the assessments in person. The exercise tentatively assessed 46% of the species threatened with extinction. It also confirmed the need for intensive research on these species, their habitat, distribution, prey base and lot more aspects. Though plantations, mining, tourism, and urbanization are the major threats, studies on the same are the need of the hour, while conservation initiatives have to be established immediately.
